Summer Terms at Loyola University Maryland are considered optional semesters. Institutional funds are not available for use during the summer term. Loan assistance through the Direct Federal Parent Loan (PLUS) Program or private alternative education loan programs may be used for summer course expenses. Students who are Federal Pell Grant eligible and who have enrolled in a minimum of 24 credits for the prior fall and spring semesters, may be eligible to use Federal Pell Grant funds in the summer. The student must be enrolled in a minimum of 2 classes (at least 6 credits) to qualify for Federal Pell Grant or Federal loans.
