

Application to become a Study Abroad Ambassador

Program Description

The Study Abroad Ambassadors are a group of Loyola student who have previously studied abroad and have been selected by the Office of International Programs to represent and promote study abroad programs at Loyola. Study Abroad Ambassadors are dedicated to promoting interest, assisting in preparation, offering support and providing a platform for communication regarding all aspects of the study abroad experience. Study Abroad alumni who are selected to participate in the program will assist the Office of International Programs in promoting study abroad opportunities through interest meetings, classroom presentations, and assistance at various events the office hosts throughout the semester. The training sessions provided by the OIP are designed to expand ambassadors' knowledge of Loyola's study abroad opportunities, enhance public speaking skills and increase confidence so that ambassadors are prepared to share their passion for study abroad and their personal study abroad experiences with the Loyola community.

What you will gain by participating in this program:

1. Membership in a close-knit community of students who share a passion for study abroad
2. Opportunities to share your study abroad experience in a variety of contexts and venues
3. Connections with students on campus as you help guide them through the study abroad exploration process
4. Enhanced public speaking skills
5. Networking with professors and offices throughout the University

Eligibility

Eligible applicants must fulfill the following requirements in order to be considered for the Study Abroad Ambassador Program:

1. Have participated in at least one study abroad program, exchange, or study tour through Loyola
2. Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
3. Enrolled as a full-time student for the intended academic year of participation
4. No history of serious disciplinary problems

Requirements and expectations

Becoming a Study Abroad Ambassador is a distinction, as you are recognized as an official student representative of the Office of International Programs and liaison between the OIP and the student body. With this distinction comes several responsibilities including:

1. Attending the mandatory SAA training at beginning of your first semester
2. Attending mandatory group meetings
3. Serving as an Ambassador at **the required minimum of events** (info sessions, interest meetings, info tables, classroom visits, etc.)
4. Maintaining good academic and disciplinary standing

Procedure for application

In order to be considered for the position of Study Abroad Ambassador, you must complete the following:

1. Submit application form by deadline of the semester for which you wish to enter (**January 1** for spring semester entrance, **August 1** for fall semester entrance).
2. After review of applications, the strongest candidates will be contacted to schedule an interview during the first two weeks of the semester.
3. The number of new ambassadors accepted each semester will vary depending on program enrollment and the current needs of the organization.

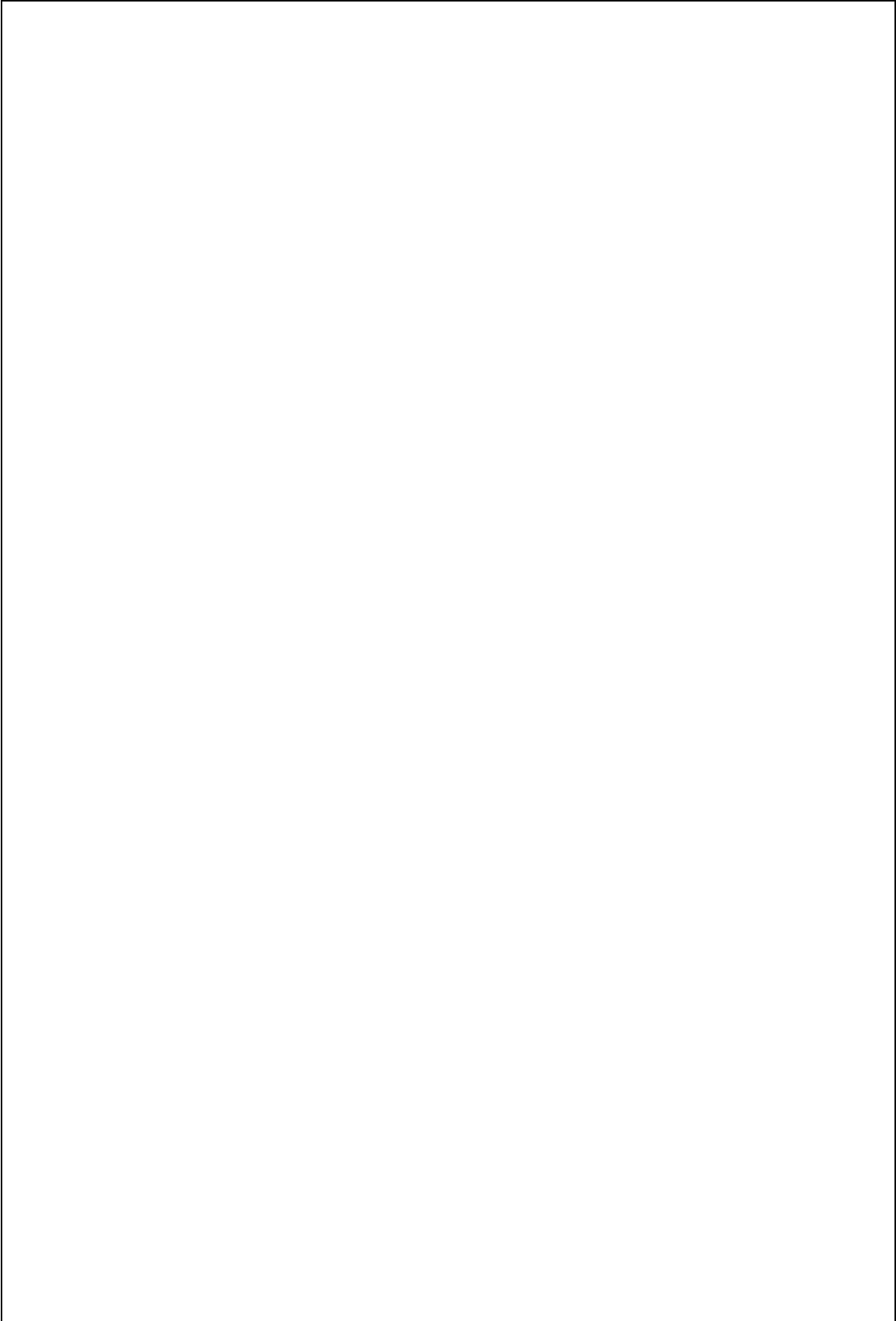
