Loyola University Maryland Anti-Hazing Policy Preamble

Loyola University Maryland holds that hazing is a fundamental violation of human dignity. As members of a Jesuit community, we believe in treating one another with respect, integrity, and kindness. Hazing has no place within our University, and we are committed to maintaining a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for all individuals. We encourage all members of our community to report any incidents of hazing to law enforcement and the University's Office of Student Conduct. Hazing will not be tolerated at Loyola University Maryland and will be met with appropriate action, which may include both disciplinary measures and legal consequences. 28 | Page Prevention is the shared responsibility of every student, faculty, staff member, and alumni, and requires a collective commitment to fostering a culture of care, respect, and accountability.
