The Title IX Coordinators and Title IX Intake Officers are readily available to meet and review your rights, resources, and reporting options available both on and off campus, including offering and implementing supportive measures for anyone who experiences sexual harm, regardless of whether they desire to file a complaint. She supports LGBTQIA+ individuals who have experienced sexual violence. Melissa is available 24/7 as the confidential advocate and will respond to campus whenever she is called. She is also available to walk with students through both the campus disciplinary process and the city's criminal process. Obtaining peace and protective orders, getting a S.A.F.E. (sexual assault forensic exam) exam at Mercy hospital, and navigating the criminal system, are a few of the many resources she can provide.

TurnAround provides wrap-around and therapeutic services for survivors of intimate-partner violence, sexual violence, and human trafficking. These services include case management, group and individual therapy, legal advocacy, emergency shelter, referrals, and employment readiness for individuals of all identities. They also have crisis response services, including a 24/7 helpline and text line to meet a survivors immediate safety needs.

Mercy Medical Center is a designated treatment center for sexual assault and domestic violence in Baltimore City. It has 30 specially trained Forensic Nurse Examiners (FNEs) available 24/7 to care for victims of sexual assault, and victims of domestic violence of all LGBTQ+ identities. The Forensic Nurse Examiner Program practices inclusive care and works collaboratively with criminal justice agencies and other Baltimore agencies addressing the needs of victims of violence regardless of how they identify.
